

Chief Antoinette Ursitti

Antoinette Ursitti, a 23-year member of the Chicago Police Department, currently serves as the Chief of the Bureau of Detectives. The Bureau of Detectives is responsible for investigating select felony and misdemeanor offenses, ensuring the care of juveniles during processing for criminal offenses or who are in need of protective services; following up on missing and found persons; and providing forensic services, among other duties. Chief Ursitti assisted in the launch of the Chicago Crime Gun Intelligence Center, a multi-agency partnership with the ATF and federal, state, and local law enforcement partners. CGIC brings together agents, officers, analysts, and prosecutors to timely and accurately receive and analyze information on all firearm related violence, arrests, and recoveries and refer incidents with investigatory merit to the most appropriate resources for follow-up. Prior to this assignment, she was Deputy Chief of the Training and Support Group and was responsible for identifying recruit, in-service, pre-service, and field training needs and ensuring Department members received training to safely, effectively, and lawfully perform their duties.
